**CITIZEN INPUT FOR ITEMS ON THE AGENDA**

**Becky Bjur**-959 Truth and owner of Woodland NAPA- spoke on the Public Utility Tax. Asked if it would be to fund Public Safety? Supports the tax if it is used for Public Safety. Volunteers do it to serve the people. City cannot continue relying on volunteers and need to hire people to serve the community to protect life and property. There are currently 36 volunteers but they also have full time jobs and out of town; if they do work inside the city, she stated that most

businesses do not allow them to leave the job to respond and still get paid; the realm of volunteer firefighters has changed over the past years. Doesn't know of any other department that has volunteers. Believes the clerks department is over staffed. The other departments are paid for employees and the council is not cutting in those departments. Encourages the council to pass the ordinance.

**Nick Husties**, 1785 Clover – is a traditional volunteer. Volunteers and responds from his home to calls. Woodland is running over 1,000 calls a year. He works a full time job and is a student. Recommends the council pass this tax to fund the fire dept.

**Rob Boren**, 1909 NE 82<sup>nd</sup> Street, Vancouver, - is a non-traditional volunteer. Previously served in Clark County. He works 24 and 12 hour shifts in Woodland. Stated that the city is getting a good deal. Doesn't know of any other departments in the area that rely on volunteers so heavily. Supports the tax.

**Frank Rumpel**, 650 CC Street - there are a lot of senior citizens in Woodland. Electric tax just went up. Encouraged the council to think about it before passing it. Look at fat in budget before increasing taxes.

**Darlene Johnson**, PO Box 1808 – reviewed the budget with Mari Ripp, Clerk-Treasurer today. stated that the budget funds are all estimates and money you don't currently have. With the projected gambling tax, the money should be used for Public Safety. Said it is not the time to consider another tax on businesses and residents. People are having to decide to have heat in their house or buy groceries. This is hurting the unemployed, the under-employed, businesses and the seniors if taxed more. The intent of the law for utilities that you charge what it costs to provide it. Legally you can put a tax on it and put it in the General Fund, but she stated that this is not the way to do it. The choice the council is putting on families is far more erroneous to families than to make the decision to not impose a new tax.
