New Life Coming to the Old Fire Station

Public Works is putting some minor touch-ups on the Old Fire Station located at 100 Davidson. The city has been seeking out proposals in hopes of revitalizing the old building. There have been some proposals for a theater, brewpub/brewer, and several other suggestions. Parts of the building needs repairs that are not currently budgeted for to make any project work... until now! I am excited to say the city has another "out-of-the-box" idea! We will be opening the fires bay doors to allow for seating and hosting food vendors outside the building. The indoor/outdoor seating will also host a children's area. This is a pilot project to stimulate downtown! We want to enhance existing businesses,

collected for space lease will be put into the park fund and back into the building. This is a temporary use through the end of December. If this venture goes well and we think it will, a full proposal will be provided to City Council to make the area permeant.

Keeping Sidewalks Clear

From time-to-time, we receive citizen communication about sidewalk obstructions. It is the property owner's responsibility to keep the sidewalks in front of their home or business free of obstructions so pedestrians can move freely. Placing your trash cans on the roadway along the curb, cutting back trees/bushes, and ensuring vehicles are not parked blocking the sidewalk are very important for access. A number of residents have mobility challenges and need the sidewalks clear.
